- Majority acquired in January 2021




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
- Established in 2017
- 100% owned subsidiary of HHLA, based in Hamburg, responsible for
 - Strategic management and development of the international subsidiaries of HHLA
 - International development of terminal portfolio of HHLA through acquisitions or new developments
- Currently five entities under management:
 - Three container terminals (CTO, TK Estonia and PLT Italy)
 - One intermodal operator in Ukraine (UIC)
 - One freight forwarding company (HHLA Project Logistics, focus on project cargo)

Ambition to integrate existing (and new) facilities into HHLA's growing hinterland network

Integration of maritime and hinterland networks for efficient supply chains



- Focus on development of interlinked regional hubs to efficiently serve the (European) hinterland
- Strong focus on railway connections, e.g.
 - Support of Amber train in Baltics States
 - Support to re-establish Tallinn as gateway for Russia
 - Efforts to position TK as part of OBOR initiative
 - Establishment of UIC to improve intermodal offering in Ukraine
 - Set-up of intermodal connections in Trieste and integration into Metrans network
- Development of non-container activities and value added services, to diversify and bind customers
 - Support in attraction of customers for value added services at TK and CTO
 - Support of cross subsidiary activities, e.g.
 Project Logistics and terminals







Rail Baltica: direct access to European rail network


Variety of modality shifts in the future terminal



- Start of Rail Baltica to be in Muuga Port, with main terminal on the territory of HHLA TK Estonia, detailed technical design ongoing
- Agreed design will allow seamless transfer of cargo between RoRo European / Russian gauge railway as well as from Russia to European gauge (and vv)
- Layout will allow to accommodate full block trains for both gauge widths
- Layout allowing to accommodate sea going containers as well as trailers (cranable and likely non-cranable trailers)
