



CMA CGM MAKES THE DECISION TO STOP ALL SPOT RATE INCREASES

Dear Valued Customers

Since the beginning of 2021, container shipping spot freight rates have continued to rise due to port congestion and the major imbalance between demand and maritime container transport effective capacity.

Although these market-driven rate increases are expected to continue in the coming months, the Group has decided to put any further increases in spot freight rates on hold for all services operated under its brands (CMA CGM, CNC, Containerships, Mercoxul, ANL, APL).

This decision applies to spot rates and is effective immediately until February 1, 2022.

CMA CGM is also investing heavily to strengthen its service offering. The Group has increased the capacity of its operated fleet by 11% since December 31, 2019, through the addition of new vessels and the purchase of second-hand vessels. Over the last 15 months, the Group has also increased its container fleet by 780,000 TEUs.

Through these measures, CMA CGM aims at strengthening its valuable customer relationships and providing support as they navigate today's difficult supply chain challenges.





Trade Turkey — EU



Turkey is the 5th largest trade partner of EU, export market and import supplier.

Certainly EU is a number one partner of Turkey for import and export. This way, total merchandise trade in 2020 made up about 164 billion Euro. An essential part of this trade is realized through road transport (trucks and trailers).



Trade Turkey - EU: transit opportunities for Ukraine and the Baltic Sea countries

Overall freight transport between the Baltic countries and Turkey is about 55 000–60 000 items/year. Goods transport between Turkey and the Scandinavian countries make up about 10 000 items/year.

Transport connection between Germany and Turkey is about 200 000 items / year, whereas about 15 000 - 20 000 items/year have their destination point in the Eastern part of Germany, close to Poland.

As a result, total potential traffic is about 90 000 items/year.



Route Operation Parameters

Port of Karasu (TR) – Chornomorsk (UA) – Slawkuw (PL) / Klaipeda (LT)

- Time schedule Karasu Chornomorsk 2 times per week, with the fixed time and date of departure.
- Transit Time 24 hours.
- Time for terminal operations (unloading, customs clearance, loading onto railway fitting platforms) in the port of Chornomorsk – 24 hours.



Route Operation Parameters

Port of Karasu (TR) – Chornomorsk (UA) – Slawkuw (PL) / Klaipeda (LT)

• Time Schedule for a block/piggyback train – 1 time per week with the fixed schedule.

Anticipated transit time:

Ukraine – Poland (Slawkuw) — not more than 48 hours

Ukraine – Lithuania (Klaipeda) — not more than 75 hours

Anticipated Annual Cargo Flow for the Line at the beginning – 2000–4000 units/year.

<u>40 – 80 units per week in each direction.</u>





Project Participants Goals

- To create and offer a new service for all the transport market players (Turkey, Ukraine, Poland, Lithuania, Latvia and any other stakeholders) along with the ferry service carriers and freight forwarding organizations aiming to diversify the transport services portfolio each participant used to have.
- To attract a share of the traffic realized through the road transport and containers on the route Turkey Germany, Poland, Latvia, Lithuania Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland and in the opposite direction.
- Alternative logistic solutions with the totally organized supply chain.
