

By Closing Gender Gap.....



- Global GDP will increase by an average of 35% with a full 20 % of those gains coming from increased productivity due to gender diversity.
- When women work, they invest 90% of their income back into their businesses and into the health and education of their families.
- As women reach their full economic potential to bridge the gender gap locally, that would add an estimated 28\$ Trillion in global GDP by 2025




