




A look at the global air logistics market



Air Logistics Capacity Development

Freighter reroutings and travel uptick



Growth remains "hot" but is slowing compared to 2019 levels. Significant trans-Atlantic growth in Q1 2022.

Increases in demand have grown exponentially versus the capacity developments required, thus leads to increasing rates.

UA/RU crisis also impacting capacity availability from APAC, loadsize reduced.



- Freighter reroutings and travel uptick drive increased air cargo capacity between Asia Pacific and the Middle East
- North East Asia accounts for 86% of the trade lane's recent capacity increase
- Shanghai's lockdown lowered international air cargo capacity -46% between 9-15 May (versus 2021)
- Potential end of lockdown in June could see air cargo capacity bounce back




#uncertainty

Sustainability program

Kuehne+Nagel's sustainability program embraces the elements of environmental, social and governance topics.

Carbon Emissions Reduction Goals

In the area of carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions, Kuehne+Nagel has set the goals in 2021 to reduce carbon emissions by 5 per cent per FTE and 5 per cent per 100 m2.

Based on these goals, in 2021, Kuehne+Nagel reduced CO2 emissions by 24 per cent per FTE, reduced 20 per cent per 100 m2, for Scope 2 (indirect emissions). Absolute carbon emissions were also reduced by 26 per cent. Reductions were accomplished by implementing awareness training sessions and by using effective emissions control technology.

Kuehne+Nagel has also established carbon reduction goals until 2030 for Scope 1, 2 and 3 based on the Science Based Targets initiative (SBTi).
