- a. ICTSI will explain the various issues and concerns of TABS presented by the group on the next scheduled meeting;
- b. The group requested to present the revenue collected on TABS from 2014 to 2022;
- c. ARTA will invite representative from PPA, ICTSI, ATI, MTPB, AISL, and CY Operator on the next scheduled meeting;
- d. A joint petition calling for the discontinuance of TABS fee.

REQUEST FOR RIA to PPA

- Relative to the key agreements of the last clarificatory meeting conducted on May 02, 2022 attended by a PPA Representative, it was agreed by the body that the Authority will send an official request for the conduct of a Regulatory Impact Assessment (RIA) on PPA AO No. 04-2021 (TOP-CRMS) which was sent by ARTA last May 16, 2022. This is in light of several concerns raised by stakeholders that an in-depth analysis be conducted prior to the issuance and implementation of the aforementioned regulatory proposal.
- The Authority requested that the following documents be submitted within **7 Working Days** upon receipt of the official notice of request:
 - Regulatory Notification Form (RNF)
 - Preliminary Impact Statement (PIS)
