EU Directive 2010/65





DIRECTIVE 2010/65/EU OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL of 20 October 2010

on reporting formalities for ships arriving in and/or departing from ports of the Member States and repealing Directive 2002/6/EC

Article 5 Electronic transmission of data

1. Member States shall accept the fulfillment of reporting formalities in electronic format and their transmission via a single window as soon as possible and in any case no later than 1 June 2015.

... omissis ...

Article 7 Information in FAL forms

Member States shall accept FAL forms for the fulfillment of reporting formalities. Member States may accept that information required in accordance with a legal act of the Union is provided in a paper format until 1 June 2015 only.

EU Directive 65/2010



Why is it important for the MED area? To Interconnect administrations and business. Data exchange within an EU Member State and with non-EU countries.

Vessels departing from MED NON EU countries should fulfill DIR. 65 formalities dealing with new processes and new IT systems to be interfaced with the National EU Maritime Single Windows

Shipowners / Agents / Ports/Portnet (National Maritime Single Window) should **adapt their systems**

E-manifest initiative

In some members states (eg. Italy):

- Preclearing (advanced clearing at sea before arrival)
- Customs monitored corridors to inland terminals or to final destinations (using AEO certification or RFID eSeal)
 - By ship
 - On truck
 - On train

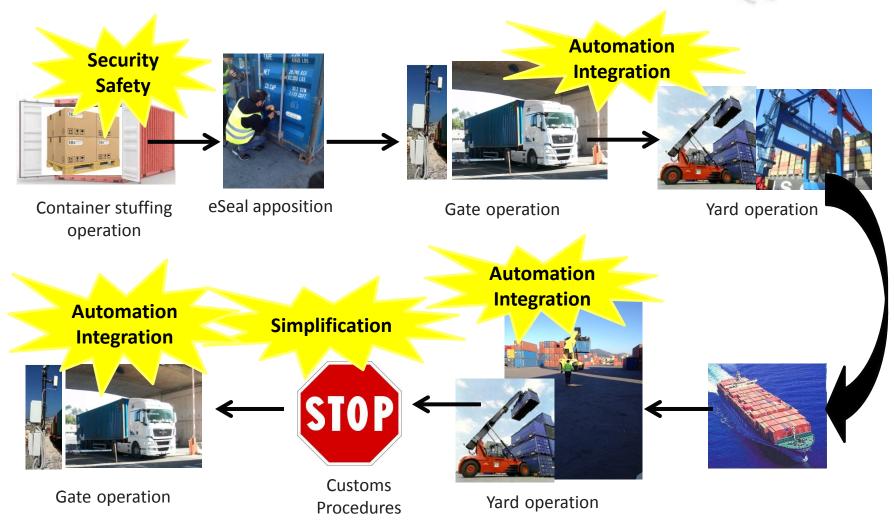
