



Underlying patterns impacting the Port industry



KEY TAKEWAYS

- Decarbonizing international shipping: IMO regulations to introduce carbon intensity measures - Energy Efficiency Existing Ship Index (EEXI) entered into force in 2023
- Decarbonizing the European economy and its outsourced networks: Forthcoming European Carbon Border Adjustment Mechanism (CBAM) will fully come into force in 2026
- Impact of UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) policies on the Port Industry
- Current and forthcoming upgrade of Containerized facilities in the IOI and Eastern and Southern Africa.
- Debt sustainability in Africa could hamper volumes and transshipment market beyond current downward trend.

ONGOING DEVELOPMENTS FOR THE EAST PORT








- Streamlining Current facilities (container: 18 ha, Roro, breakbulk: 8 ha)
 4+2 new STS (outreach 20 rows) 1+1 MCH able (outreach 14 rows)
- 2. Short term development: reefer terminal upgrade (500 reefer plugs)
- 3. Shift from coal to biomass for energy imports (storage capacity: 160 000 m3)
- 4. Relocation of the oil terminal
- **5. Development of the New Support Services area:** (85 Ha)
- 6. Container terminal extension reclaimed from the sea (2030)
