


CREATING HUB FOR GLOBAL TRADE AND CONNECTING MARKETS THROUGHOUT AFRICA AND BEYOND

The new MPS Terminal 3 facility at Tema Port is strategically positioned at the centre of the West Africa coastline making it the ideal place for Transit and Transhipment.

Since the completion of the 3rd new Berth by the end of 2019, the MPS Terminal 3 rapidly gained the recognition as a maritime hub providing the most efficient one-stop port services centre in the region and the rest of Africa. This was achieved through heavy investment in Infrastructure and Superstructure along with digitalisation and manpower development.

Several Shipping lines are already utilising this emerging new hub port while others are redeploying and optimising some of their services to/from West Africa taking into consideration the capabilities and extended capacities at MPS Terminal 3.

Not only transhipment but also domestic Trade & Industry are reaping the benefits of being directly connected to a hub-port being a first port of call on the western coastline of Africa that provide excellent transit time and efficient connectivity to a wider market range.




Transhipment at MPS Terminal 3


