ABOUT THE PORT

- The Port of Constanta is located at the crossroads of the trade routes linking the markets of the landlocked countries from Central and Eastern Europe with the Caspian region, Central Asia and the Far East.
- It is the main Romanian port on the Black Sea, playing a highly important role as the transit node for the landlocked countries in the Central and South-East Europe.

MARITIME PORT

- The Port of Constanța is located on the Western coast of the Black Sea, at 179 nM from the Bosphorus Strait and 85 nM from the Sulina Branch, through which the Danube flows into the sea.
- It covers 3,926 ha of which 1,313 ha is land and the rest of 2,613 ha is water
- Constanta Port has a handling capacity of over 100 million tons per year and 156 berths, of which 140 berths are operational
- The total quay length is 29.83 km, and the depths range between 8 and 19 meters
- These characteristics are comparable with those offered by the most important European and international ports, allowing the accommodation of tankers with capacity up to 165,000 dwt, bulk-carriers up to 220,000 dwt and port-containers up to 10.000 TEU's.





PORT CHARACTERISTICS

- 43 port operators are providing services for all types of cargo
- 100 forwarding companies ensures the mobility and multi-modality of the cargo flows
- Over 700 entities are perforiming their activitivities every day
- 10 agri-bulk operators delivers high quality services ranking
 Constanța as the first port for agri-bulk in Europe
- The largest container terminal at the Black Sea
- The deepest port in the Black Sea up to 18.5 operational depth
- The largest ship that entered in Black Sea was unloaded in our port "Hebbei Succes" 22 m lenght, 58 m height and 233,592 dwt








PORT STATISTICS

Total traffic




- 2018's operated traffic reprents the third best volume operated in the history of the port
- the record was registered in 1989 62.3 mil. tons and the second best volume in 2008 61.8 mil. tons




PORT STATISTICS

River traffic




• River traffic represents 20,6% of the total throughput, out of which transit is 46% and cabotage 51%

 \bullet Container traffic is represented mainly by imports 48% and exports 48%, container transit being 4%

PORT CONNECTIONS

Constanța Port has connections with all the modes of transport:

- Road direct connection with A2 Highway to Bucharest
- Rail direct connection with the national rail network
- Pipeline direct connection with pipeline network to the largest refineries in the country
- Inland waterways direct connection with River Danube through the Danube-Black Sea Canal
- Constanta Port is part of the *Rheine-Maine-Danube* TEN-T Corridor













PORT HINTERLAND

- ✓ Port of Constanţa hinterland is mainly represented by the Danube riparian countries of Central and East Europe, including: Austria, Bulgaria, Hungary, Moldavia, Slovenia, Ukraine and Serb Republic
- √ The port is hub for agri-bulk cargoes, being the maritime port of the crops produced in Eastern Europe

HUB FOR AGRI-BULK


- Agribulk traders presence that control the entire logistic chain from departure to destination, ensuring a constant flow of cargo transiting the port – average of 18 mil. tons/yearly
- 10 modern and performant handling terminals
- Connections with all modes of transport Danube plays an important role being the best mode to transport dry and liquid bulk cargoes
- Large storage capacities over 1 mil. tons
- Maritime port of Serbia and Hungary agri-bulk cargoes

PORT FORELAND

- ✓ Foreland of Constanta Port is represented by Trans Caucasus and Caspian Sea countries: Georgia, Azerbaidjan, Kazahstan, Turkmenistan etc.
- √ The perfect gateway for intermodal corridors linking these areas to Central and Eastern Europe
