



Main connections between Caspian and Black Sea options



Middle Corridor and the logistics hubs that connects trains from North West China, Kazakhstan, Azerbaijan and Georgian hubs, canvasing and delivering also the cargoes from or to the Caspian region and neighbor countries and link them by multimodal transport chain to the Black Sea ports for further destinations in Europe and worldwide.



Seasonal sea-river vessels from the Caspian Sea to the Black Sea on the internal waterways, the Sea of Azov and the Black Sea basin. With the limited seasonal nature of this mode of transport, workable for the existing port facilities in the Caspian Sea and for the goods with standardization and containerization limits, project or oversize cargoes but also for big volume goods which face similar seasons of trading with the sailing period on the internal waterways.

- We will need to develop the multimodal transport and infrastructure for the Central Asia and Black Sea connection as the cargo's transshipment solutions to enhance other markets targeted by the main users of the Central Asia and Caspian market.
- We need to focus on the Central Asia as well as to Eastern and Central Europe for the necessity to connect the markets. Consumer's goods, resources and technology, chemicals, fertilizers or traditional products of the Caspian region such as cotton, raw materials or others, needs to meet in the demand – offer debate without the limits of transportation.
- We have to link Caspian market to the global container or break bulk networks services to all areas of the world using the Black Sea main ports.
- We believe that key link is to develop and improve the actual transport and logistics solutions. The train corridors should be the direct connected by a sea bridge" to the main containers transshipment ports in the Black Sea such as Constanta Port, by regular direct feeder service from Georgian Ports Poti or Batumi.
- The feeder's capacity should be gradually dimensioned to the volume of goods flows on the corridors and their developments.

The limits to be overcome at the beginning:


- to insure the necessary steady break-even point volumes of cargoes on both ways.
- -to achieve acceptable operating costs in the Black Sea ports and optimizing the feeder's running costs.



AKTAU / BAKU / POTI OR BATUMI / CONSTANTA INTERMODAL HUBs



- The first step to connect over the Caspian Sea with regular feeder service from Aktau to Baku on weekly basis was already done.
- Next step should enable and optimize the connection of the cargoes flows from the train corridors to the ports that has regular services to and from the Black Sea ports with the Mediterranean Sea, Persian Gulf, North Africa, Far East, Central and Northern Europe or the United States.
- COSCO Shipping has a proactive attitude towards the Caspian market and in order to provide more logistic support and assistance in the development of the containerized and multimodal transport, we have established the agencies and sub-agencies that are actively involved within the related markets. We are delivering transport services in Romania, Moldavia, Georgia, Azerbaijan, Turkey, Ukraine, Russia and we develop markets as Kazakhstan or Turkmenistan.
- Also, COSCO Shipping has improved and upgraded during last period containers, general cargoes and project cargoes services to Black Sea, that connects now with the worldwide transport network.







- New deep sea to sea-river vessels connection solutions, already used in the TCO project by COSCO Shipping to transport by the semisubmersible vessels, the modular industrial parts and equipment that brings cost-effectiveness in the industrial development of the Caspian region.



Black Sea, Constanta Port to Central and Eastern European countries



- Constanta Port the Eastern European gate to Central and Eastern Europe: Austria, Bulgaria, Hungary, Moldavia, Slovenia, Germany, Czech Republic, Serb Republic and Croatia
- River transport with barges to the Danube riparian countries from Constanta, an inexpensive and convenient way of transport for large typology of goods, either bulk or containerized cargoes, connecting destinations in Romania, Bulgaria, Serbia, Hungary, Austria, Slovakia, Germany.
- COSCO Shipping in partnership with specialized logistics providers has developed Sea-river connection with Girugiulesti, Moldavia for containers, on weekly service connecting our worldwide network via Constanta Port
- COSCO Shipping perform regular over gauge and project cargoes transshipments from our MPP vessels to barges, for cargoes from Asia or other regions to Danube destinations. Also we perform bulk raw materials shipments on weekly service from Caucasian region via Poti and in transshipment through Constanta Port to final destination Serbia.
- Domestic haulage and rail multimodal solutions for the local market and neighboring countries.
