- Establishing and encouraging the relationship with the States along the Silk Road at the institutional, nongovernmental and business level
- Bringing together the decision makers, authorities, business environment in order to reconstruct and develop the transport corridor connecting Romania within the Euro Asian Corridor
- Promotion of the business relations and economical trades between the parties along the Silk Road
- Acting to link the authorities/States and the private sector to promote the transport connection between the Black Sea and Caspian Sea, creating a bridge between Europe and Asia

- the economic exchanges between Romania-Georgia-Azerbaijan-Kazakhstan-Turkmenistan-Uzbekistan-China
- the existent and ongoing developing economic exchanges between the countries of the European Union and Georgia, Azerbaijan, Kazakhstan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan and China
- the position of Romania, which through its Black Sea ports is connecting the Europe to the Far East, ensuring a direct intermodal connection to/from the Central and North - Western part of Europe
- the geographical position and the great potential for developing the intermodal transport between Romania-Georgia-Azerbaijan-Kazakhstan-Turkmenistan-Uzbekistan-China

- 1. To cooperate in order to analyze the transport conditions and to identify the problems/bottlenecks leading to less utilization of the intermodal transport solution offered by the corridor between Romania –Georgia Azerbaijan- Kazahstan Turkmenistan Uzbekistan China for the transport on the:
- Maritime segment: Romania /ports Constanta, Galati, Braila Georgia/ports Poti and Batumi
- Road/rail segment: Georgia Azerbaijan
- Maritime segment: Azerbaijan/port Baku Kazahstan /port Aktau, maritime ports port of Turkmenbasi/Turkmenistan
- Road/rail segment between Kazakhstan Turkeminstan Uzbekistan China And/or
- Deep sea segment between China ports and Romanian maritime ports
 These bottlenecks could be connected to: the infrastructure, procedures, regulations which
 need to be harmonized and integrated, or by the lack of knowledge on the advantages
 offered by the Transport Corridor.

- 2. To cooperate with the authorities of the states of the Transport Corridor in order to find a solution to theses barriers/bottlenecks and to promote the use of transport On the route Romania-Georgia-Azerbaijan Kazahstan-Turkmenistan– Uzbekistan China.
- 3. To promote the harmonization of the national transport strategies on the direction of supporting the development of the Strategic Transport Corridor between Romania Georgia-Azerbaijan-Kazakhstan-Turkmenistan- Uzbekistan- China.
- 4. To promote a permanent dialogue between the Parties, as well as between the Parties, authorities and the private companies from their states, in order to increase the awareness on the importance of this transport route.

- 5. To cooperate and to assure mutual international support and representation for the development of the transport corridor, promoting the use of this corridor and its advantages to all concerned envisaged parties.
- 6. To promote the Transport Corridor in their countries and at the European and international level, supporting the European and international recognition of the Strategic Transport Corridor between Romania-Georgia-Azerbaijan-Kazakhstan-Turkmenistan- Uzbekistan- China.
- 7. To ally within a Union for Transport and Logistics of Europe-Far East/Black Sea-Caspian Sea, having annual and periodical meetings, with debates related to the Transport Corridor, news and proposed actions to be taken to promote the corridor, also by using the social networks.
- 8. To commonly participate to the exhibitions, conferences and other type of events at international level.

- 9. To take the necessary steps in order to initiate common projects, financed by state, private or European/international funds.
- 10. To take the necessary steps for the recognition and integration of the Transport Corridor between Romania-Georgia-Azerbaijan-Kazahstan-Turkmenistan-Uzbekistan- China into the Trans European Transport Network TEN- T and into the European transport policies related to the neighboring countries.
- 11. To make lobby within the private entities, to support the Transport Corridor.
- 12. To exchange experience, in order to have a clear perception of the local realities on transport, logistic and economic activities of each country of the Parties. Therefore, each Party can delegate one representative who, for one or two weeks could be accommodated in this respect by any of the other Parties.
- 13. To facilitate professional education and education exchange and know how, in the institutes and maritime universities within the countries of the Parties
