- The establishment of MPC's subsidiary company, the Muara International Fish Landing Sdn. Bhd. (MIFL).

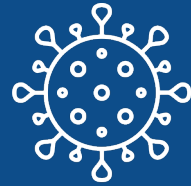

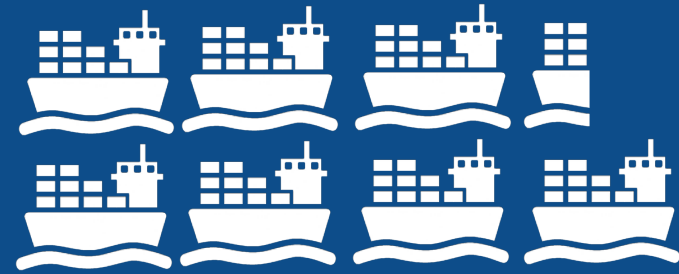

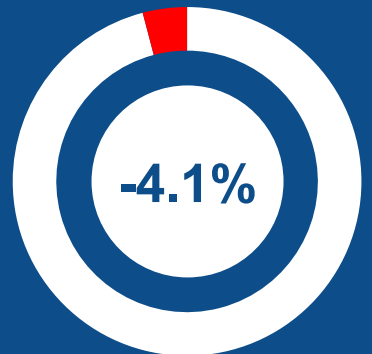

Brunei first outbreak

Brunei Darussalam, a country with a population of 459 400, recorded its first imported case on March 9, and as of April 20 has detected 138 cases. Assessed against several parameters including a slowing trajectory since the 100th confirmed case, limited local transmission, and the absence of cases with no known epidemiological links, Brunei compares favourably with Singapore, Taiwan, and others considered to have implemented a successful response operation.

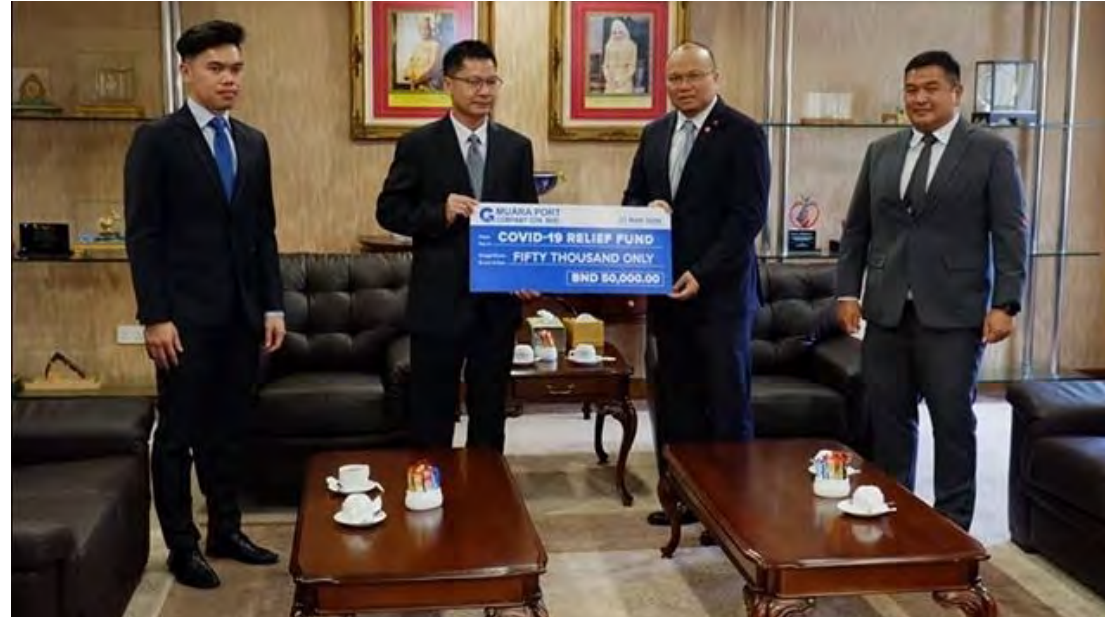

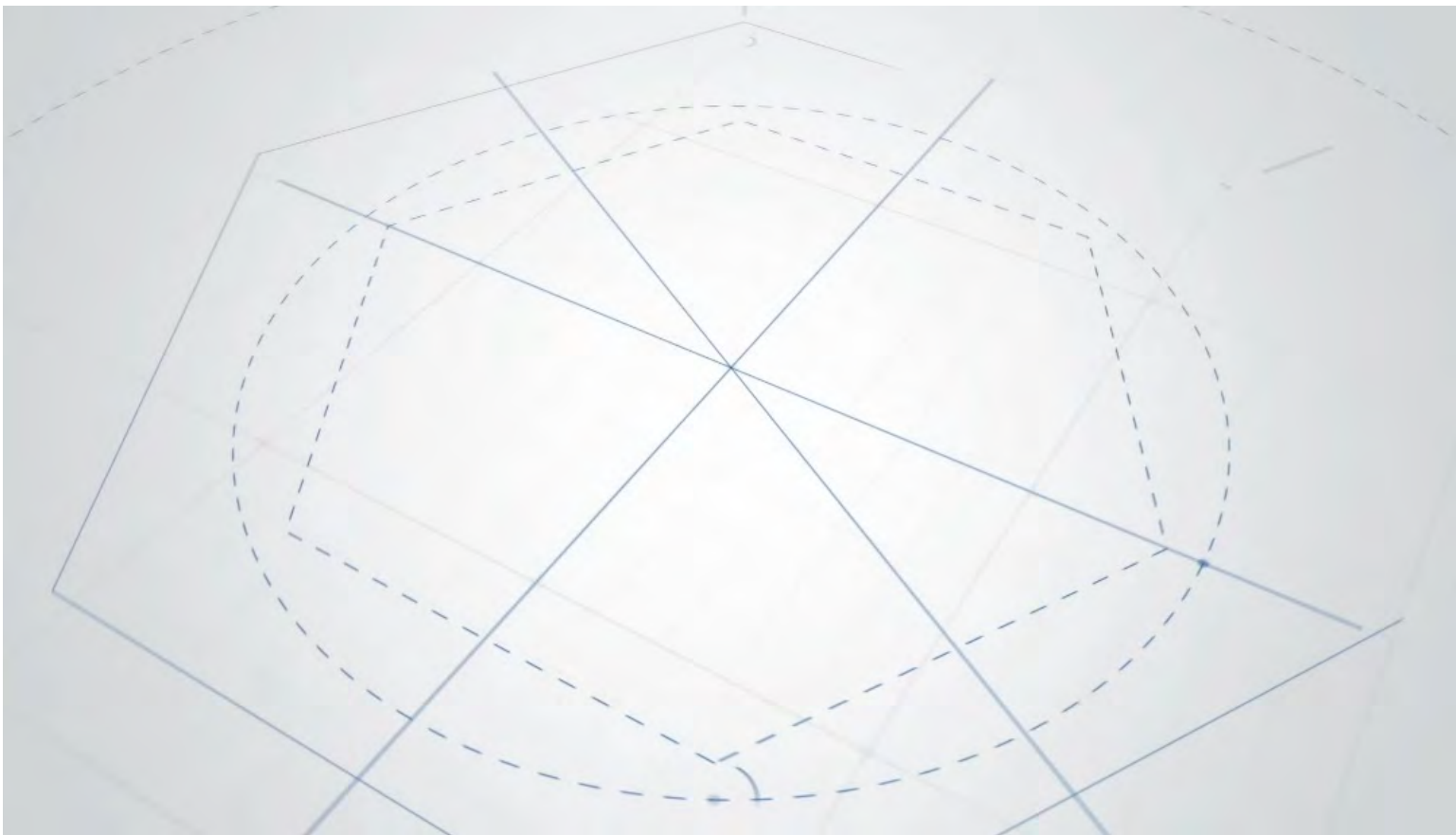

Muara International Fish Landing (MIFL)

MIFL is currently the only fish landing wharf in Brunei equipped with an array of facilities that include cold storage, ice making, and net mending areas.

In 2021, MPC also signed an agreement with the Brunei government to develop and operate the country's largest fishing complex. A potential upside of involvement in the strategic "New Land-Sea Route."

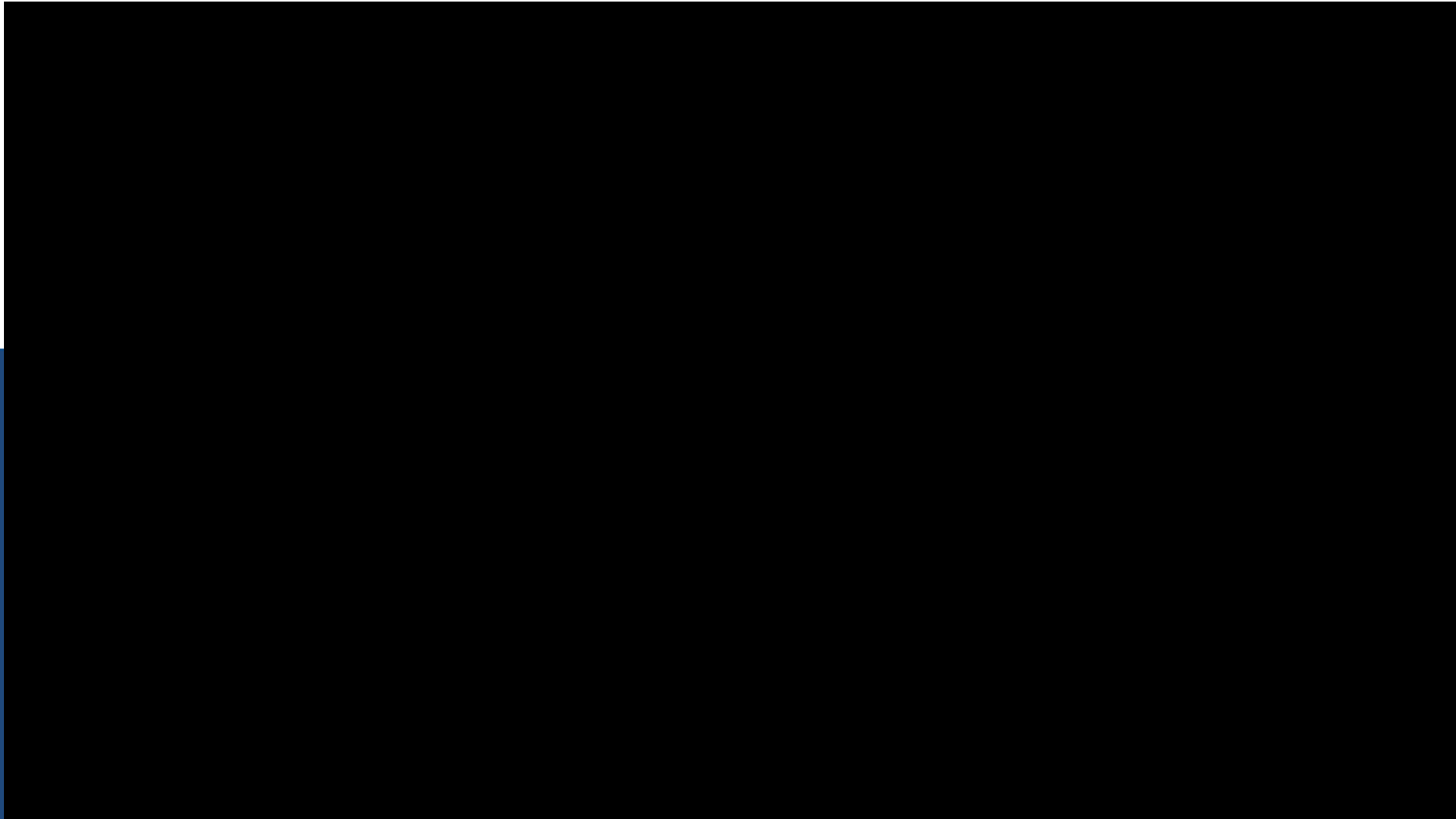

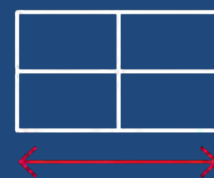

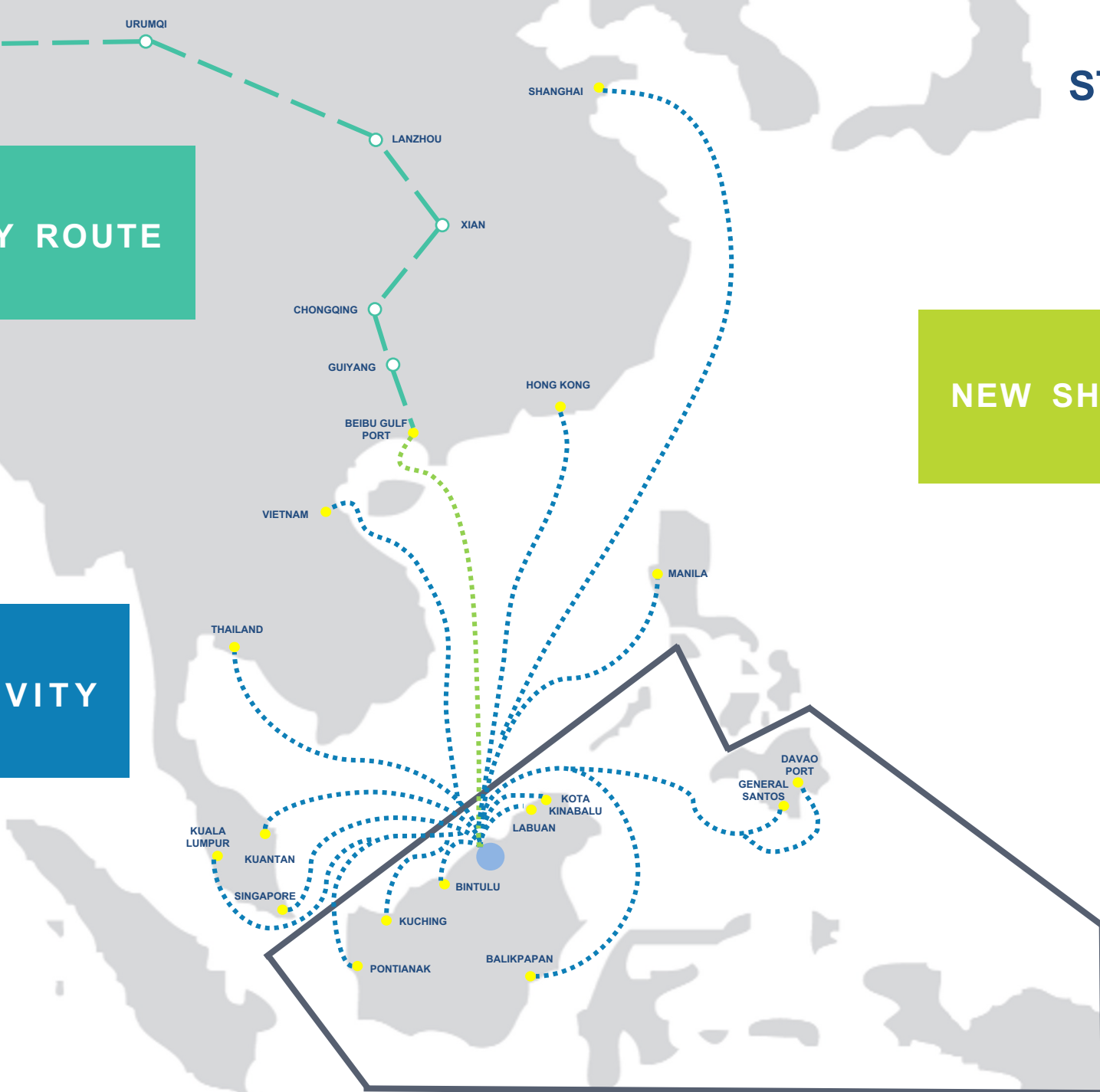
