GLOBAL SUPPLY CHAIN DISRUPTION

The pandemic and the Russia – Ukraine conflict exposed existing issues within the supply chain

- 1. Shifts in demand
- 2. Logistics disruption
- 3. Workforce and labor
- 4. Limited number of third parties (both suppliers and customers).
- 5. Limited visibility on the entire chain





CURRENT TRENDS IN GLOBAL SUPPLY CHAIN

- Sustainability: Focus shifted from cost reduction and productivity to business continuity, environmental and human impact
- 2. Technology: More demanding consumers, operations focused on technology and innovation, availability of information, faster growth. Need for agility and resilience





POSSIBLE FUTURE TRENDS IN GLOBAL SUPPLY CHAIN

- 1. Over supply risk: Lower demand due to current economic crises can lead to over supply
- 2. Little improvement in labor supply: Labor actions, possible China lockdown
- 3. Surplus of ships: some ship orders expected to be delivered in 2023
- 4. Climate change: Falling water levels, heat waves





SUPPLY CHAIN IN THE WEST AFRICAN SUB REGION

- Changing demographics: growing urban population, growing middle class, shift in taste
- Energy poverty vs energy transition: What is the place of sustainability?
- Challenges with cargo handling activities: various bottlenecks across the logistics chain

- Supply chain diversification: enhancing domestic capabilities, localization vs centralization
